

## SPMA Top Ten Recorder April 2011 Report

Everyone should have been notified through the March Streamlines about the change to the Record policy as far as certificates are handled. Now that the application deadline for all USMS record applications is 90 days after the end of the season of the swim, we won't be using the Rulebook times-to-break as the criteria for a certificate.

From the description of the new policy ([http://www.usms.org/comp/2011\\_record\\_policy.pdf](http://www.usms.org/comp/2011_record_policy.pdf)):  
After that deadline has passed, the Records Administrator will generate an official Records Progression for every event in which a record was broken. This progression will be based on the date of the swim. Swimmers who appear on the Records Progression – those who held the record for any period of time during the season – will receive a certificate.

If anyone has any questions regarding the new policy, please let me know.
